

Academic General Internists: Clinician-Scientist

Queen's Department of Medicine, Section of General Internal Medicine (GIM), is seeking a qualified General Internist to join our growing group. Faculty will provide inpatient care on the Clinical Teaching Units, supervising and teaching Queen's medical students and residents. Applicants should have an interest in Medical Education and/or Research with a preference being given to candidates with a Masters Degree or higher in Medical Education or Clinical Epidemiology. Experience with ICES or other large databases would be considered an asset. The successful candidate will be responsible for leading a program in clinical research at Queen's University. In addition, there will be a focus of providing exemplary clinical service and the successful applicant must demonstrate strong potential for teaching at both the undergraduate and postgraduate level.

Members of the Department of Medicine enjoy a competitive compensation package, including a generous benefit plan. Academic rank will be commensurate with experience.

Candidates must be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. Preference will be given to those who either hold or are eligible for certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Internal Medicine.

One of Canada's leading universities, Queen's has a long reputation for academic excellence, research, and a diverse and vibrant learning environment. Applications are to include a letter summarizing expertise, qualifications and accomplishments relevant to the position together with a curriculum vitae, biography and the names and full contact information of three referees. The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada"; OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada".
