

Academic Hematologist: Division Chair or Clinician-Scholar

The Division of Hematology at Queen's University is growing. We seek an additional Hematologist to join our group as a full-time academic faculty member, ideally to fulfill the role of Division Chair. Individuals with expertise in either benign or malignant hematology are encouraged to apply.

The Division of Hematology is housed within the Department of Medicine, with very close ties with the Department of Oncology. It comprises ten faculty members, and also benefits from excellent collaborative working relationships with the Departments of Pathology and Molecular Medicine and Pediatrics. The group provides clinical care to a large catchment area with specialty clinics including bleeding disorders, and a well-supported in-patient program including acute leukemia and autologous stem cell transplantation. There is a thriving subspecialty training program, as well as high-quality externally funded research programs. The successful applicant will be responsible to the Division of Hematology within the Department of Medicine and Department of Oncology. Members of the Department of Medicine enjoy a competitive compensation package, including a generous benefit plan. Academic rank will be commensurate with experience.

Applicants must demonstrate evidence of providing exemplary clinical service and a strong academic portfolio. Applicants must exhibit potential for teaching at both the undergraduate and postgraduate level, as well as an ability to engage in collaborative research and contribute to the administrative functions of the University and hospitals. The ideal candidate will possess strong leadership skills, excellent communication skills and display an ability to work in a collaborative environment. Protected research time would be considered for an appropriate candidate.

For the Division Chair role, the successful applicant will be expected to oversee the activities and contributions of the Division of Hematology in the areas of clinical excellence, research initiatives and outstanding teaching. The Chair would join the leadership team of the Department of Medicine comprised of fourteen divisions. The successful applicant must demonstrate strong leadership skills and he/she would be expected to have experience in a leadership role.

Candidates must be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. Preference will be given to those who either hold or are eligible for certification in hematology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

One of Canada's leading universities, Queen's has a long reputation for academic excellence, research, and a diverse and vibrant learning environment. With its strong tradition of public service, the University has helped to shape Canadian values and policies, educating notable political and cultural figures. Queen's is located on the shore of Lake Ontario in the heart of the community in historic Kingston, midpoint between Montreal, Toronto and Ottawa.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada"; OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada". Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

Applications are to include a letter summarizing expertise, qualifications and accomplishments relevant to the position, together with a curriculum vitae as well as the names and full contact information of three referees.
