

Call Stipend Rules

R1 CALL

1. In-house call with next am rounding and home by 10am: This is an house call (\$105).
2. Palliative care home call: This is \$52.50. If you work more than four hours in hospital during the call period, of which more than one hour is past midnight and before 6 am, you are entitled to be a paid the in-hospital call stipend.
3. Emergency medicine rotation: overnight shift is a qualifying shift (\$52.50). Evening shifts that end a midnight, once again, for these, if you spend an hour past midnight in hospital working, you get a qualifying shift (\$52.50). Both the weekend and the weekdays qualify for a qualifying shift.

R2 CALL

1. Senior ER call (ends at 10pm): This is home call. However, if you stay past 11pm, it gets converted to in-house (\$105).
2. Senior CCU call with am rounding the next day and home by 10am: this is an in-house call (\$105).
3. Night float: This is an in-house shift (\$105).
4. Weekend rounding for R2s and R3s when not on call: This is considered home call. However, if you spend 12 hours in hospital rounding on a weekend day (applies to both Saturday and Sunday) when not on call, this will get converted to an in-house call stipend (\$105).

R3 CALL

1. D4 / ICU call: in-house call (\$105),
2. Jeopardy call (R2s can be put on after having done ICU): home call (\$52.50) unless activated, at which point, it gets converted to in-house (\$105).

STIPEND SUBMISSION

Accordingly to PARO, call stipend claims must be submitted to the person(s) designated by the hospitals (Internal Medicine chief residents (queensimcr@gmail.com)) to receive such claims within 30 days following the end of the month in which the call was worked.
