



## Medicine Subspecialty Admissions

Patients with unique subspecialty needs are to be admitted to the appropriate subspecialty services.

### Subspecialty Medicine Admissions as of July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020:

Subspecialty Medical Service	Patient Criteria
<b>Endocrinology</b>	Radioactive Iodine (RAI) treatment
<b>Gastroenterology</b>	Advanced / Complex IBD management, procedural complications, Medication access
<b>Hematology</b>	Acute leukemia, In-patient Chemotherapy, Incident (NEW) Stem Cell Transplant, Complicated Febrile Neutropenia (Feb Neut in patients with aplastic anemia, SCT, acute leukemia)
<b>Nephrology</b>	Incident (NEW) Renal Transplants, Dialysis access issue (NOT line sepsis), Medication access, Admission for renal biopsy
<b>Palliative Care</b>	Complex Palliative symptom issues
<b>Respirology</b>	Cystic Fibrosis with exacerbation

- Between 8am-10pm Monday- Sunday, the relevant subspecialty service should be contacted by ERP for the admission.
- From 10pm to 8am, the ED Medicine team will complete the admission for the subspecialty service, ensuring handover given to Subspecialty fellow/Attending.
- Any patients with a moderate to high probability of COVID-19, regardless of their subspecialty issue, should be admitted to CTU-E. Patients with low probability of COVID-19 who have a swab done can still be admitted to the appropriate subspecialty service.
