

Guideline for Surgical Procedures for Patients Admitted to CTU

The following applies to patients admitted to a CTU medicine team who require a surgical procedure that ocurs in the Operating Room (OR).

Goal: The patient's best interests should be kept in mind when determining the most appropriate MRP service, including the patient's nursing needs for post-operative care.

- Generally, the expectation is that the patient's <u>care will be transferred to the surgical team</u> postoperatively. If there are disputes / misunderstandings between the residents the Medical and Surgical Attendings should discuss directly.
 - o MRP and Service will be transferred to the surgical team post-operatively
 - o There is NO expectation that the patient will be transferred back to Medicine
 - The patient shall go from PACU to the appropriate surgical ward (and NOT back to the Medicine ward)
- 'Auto-transfers' back to Medicine are not acceptable all requested transfers to Medicine have to go through the GIM consult service
- Attempts to 'bargain' or only offering surgery if medicine agrees to take the patient back postoperatively are not acceptable & should be immediately communicated to the CTU director and/or COS.
- Exceptions include patients who require minor procedures to assist in the diagnosis or management of a patient on CTU:
 - Examples include: Diagnostic biopsies e.g. LN /fat pad/pleural/peritoneal/temporal artery/muscle/nerve/mass, debridement of wounds, digit amputation, septic joint washout in patients with sepsis / IE. (NB: isolated septic joints, foot or leg amputations admitted to orthopedics or vascular)
 - PD catheter insertion (isolated PD catheter insertions admitted to Nephrology), AV fistula
- Patients who have active medical problems can be assessed and followed by the GIM consult service who are available 24/7.
- As with any surgical patient, if active medical issues arise that require CTU services, the GIM consult service will transfer the patient to CTU
 - Patients will not be transferred back to CTU solely for disposition issues
