Applications are invited for a Term Adjunct to teach a three-credit load graduate level course entitled

**TMED 800: Translational Medicine**

**Course Description:**

This course is a 4-month (1-term) graduate course in which students will be exposed to and practice translating medical knowledge using examples from a variety of medical disciplines. Course content will consist of weekly, 2-hour classroom sessions, as well as monthly, half-day clinical observerships. Classroom sessions will be divided into a traditional 1- hour lecture by a TMED faculty member from the Department of Medicine or the Faculty of Health Sciences, followed by an hour of interactive discussion and 3-minute student presentations. Clinical observerships will involve direct placement of graduate students within various clinics at KGH or Hotel Dieu Hospital.

Students will have the opportunity to observe and interact with clinicians and patients in a clinical setting.

**Qualifications for the Appointment:**

Interested individuals are required to have a PhD in a Health Sciences-related discipline or a post-graduate degree with teaching experience in a related course.

**Duties and Responsibilities:**

The successful candidate will be responsible for annually updating the course syllabus, incorporating existing course materials (on-line modules), compiling, and distributing additional course materials as required, attending weekly classes, communicating effectively with students, marking assignments, providing feedback, assigning grades, and providing on-campus or virtual office hours.

**Salary:**

In accordance with the Queen's University Faculty Association collective agreement.

**Application Materials:**

It is asked that all interested and qualified candidates submit a complete and current curriculum vitae, and the names and contact information for two referees who may be contacted.
