**TMED 801: Profession of Medicine**

Period of Appointment: September 1, 2026 – April 30, 2027

**Course Description:**

This course is an 8-month (2-term) on campus graduate course in which students will be immersed in the professional learning environment of Medicine. Course content will consist of attendance at a minimum number of Medical Grand Rounds (20), followed by a one hour facilitated small group discussions after selected Medical Grand Rounds. Students will be expected to lead one discussion session in the presence of the Grand Round speaker. The lead student will then write a Critical Thinking Report which will be posted online to continue the discussion with their peers. Student seminars will be held during the winter term to present thesis research projects.

**Qualifications for the Appointment:**

Interested individuals are required to have a PhD in a Health Sciences-related discipline or a post-graduate degree with teaching experience in a related course.

**Duties and Responsibilities:**

The successful candidate will be responsible for annually updating the course syllabus, incorporating existing course materials (on-line modules), compiling, and distributing additional course materials as required, attending weekly classes, communicating effectively with students, marking assignments, providing feedback, assigning grades, and providing on-campus or virtual office hours.

**Salary:**

In accordance with the Queen's University Faculty Association collective agreement.

It is asked that all interested and qualified candidates submit a complete and current curriculum vitae, and the names and contact information for two referees who may be contacted.
