Our primary way of contacting you will be through your **Queen's email address**; please check your account regularly or set up email forwarding to your primary email account. You will also be provided with a KHSC email account for your clinical work, again please make sure to check this regularly as well for hospital updates.

Mail

Each resident has a **mailbox** in the QIM Office (Etherington Hall, Room 3022) and you should be checking your mailbox on a monthly basis. Electives Rotations

When applying for an Elective rotation, all residents are required to submit an <u>Elective Request Form</u> to Emily Barnes in the QIM office. This form should be submitted **at least 4 weeks** (1 block) prior to the start of the Elective Rotation. The QIM office will then issue a Letter of Good Standing. We will distribute the proper assessment form once we have received the full name & email address of your Elective Supervisor.

Selective or Research Rotations

All research rotations require approval from Dr. Gauthier (Program Director); residents are required to submit a Research Proposal Form at least 4 weeks (1 block) prior to the start of the Research Rotation. If a resident is choosing a clinical selective rotation, they must inform both Emily and Geneviève in the QIM Office which department they will be working with at least 4 weeks prior to the start of the Selective Rotation. If residents fail to submit their Research Proposal 4 weeks in advance of the rotation, they will be scheduled automatically on a clinical rotation.

All residents who complete a Research Rotation must present at Resident Research Day which will take place in May 2023. These presentations may be Podium Presentations or Poster Presentations.

Conference Funding

If you are requesting funding for presenting at a conference, you must submit a <u>Conference Funds</u> Request Form at least 4 – 6 weeks prior to the conference for funding approval. This form must be submitted to Geneviève in the QIM Office. Geneviève will follow up to confirm what amount of funding you are eligible to receive.

For reimbursement of funds, you will need to submit the following to Geneviève within 30 days of your return to Kingston:

- All electronic receipts



- Proof of attendance (name badge or certificate of attendance/participation)
- All boarding passes (either electronic or physical paper)
- Copy of the agenda/program from the event

Resident Responsibilities

If you require a switch in calls, **it is your responsibility** to find a resident to switch calls with. Once you have found someone, you are to notify Emily who will update the call schedule, your senior residents on the team, **and** the Chief Medical Residents. If you find someone to take your call shift, it is courteous of you to take one of theirs. We expect that you would trade a weekend shift for a weekend shift and a weekday shift for a weekday shift in return.

If you are sick, please immediately contact the Chief Medical Residents, Emily, **and** your senior/attending on service.

If you are sick and not available for a call, **it is your responsibility** to find a resident to switch calls with. Once you have found someone, you are to notify Emily, who will update the call schedule accordingly, your senior residents on the team, **and** the Chief Medical Residents. In the event you are unable to find someone who is able to switch with you, please contact Emily and the Chief Medical Residents as soon as possible for assistance.

Academic Advisors

All first-year residents will be paired up with an Academic Advisor (AA) who will serve as their coach and mentor throughout their three years in the Core Internal Medicine Residency program. Rachel O'Dell from the QIM Office will reach out to connect residents with their Academic Advisors within the first month of residency. Rachel will send reminders throughout the year of when you should be meeting with your AAs, but it is the responsibility of the resident to organize these meetings.


